Health promotion is integral to all parts of the service.

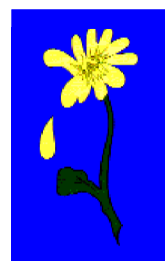

COMMUNITY GYNAECOLOGY & REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH CARE

Module 1 – The Essentials of Community Gynaecology

Module 2 – Reproductive Health in the Community

Module 3 – The Menopause and Beyond

Module 4 – Infections and Women's Health

Module 5 – Public Health and Women's Health

Module 6 – The Mind/Hormone Interface in Community Gynaecology

This is a three year, modular, part-time, multi-disciplinary course available at Certificate, Diploma and MSc level. It is designed to provide a firm theoretical background to underpin the clinical experience of doctors training to be consultants in community gynaecology, doctors in primary health care and specialist nurses who wish to develop further an interest in women's health. It provides postgraduate tuition in the special skills needed for the organisation of reproductive health care in the community. Learning methods include lectures, seminars, workshops and clinical case studies. Assessment is based on assignments, clinical dissertations and a final MSc project in the third year. **In addition, each of the above modules, which carry 25 CATS points at Masters level, may be taken separately as a Postgraduate Award (PGA) or as part of the new Flexible Masters Programme at Warwick.**

SEXUAL AND REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH

This is a one-year multi-disciplinary course at Certificate level. It is open to qualified health professionals with an interest in sexual health and consists of two one-week taught modules (in March and June) supplemented by self-directed learning and assessed on the basis of written assignments.

This course provides understanding of the issues of contraception, abortion and fertility – specialist subject areas that are central to the study of sexual and reproductive health – and offers a complete theoretical insight into the aetiology of the genito-urinary infections relevant to women's health. Students will also gain an appreciation of the importance of research in the area and how it can be applied to formulate best practice.

The Certificate in Sexual and Reproductive Health carries 60 CATS points at Masters level.

Students wishing to progress beyond the certificate may use these points as part of the requirement for an MSc.
