Missed pill rules: response from the CEU

The Clinical Effectiveness Unit acknowledges the points raised by Drs Donegan¹ and Mansour² in their letter and commentary article, respectively, published in this Journal. In our initial draft of the missed pill statement, the text was more detailed and included a section on practical application of missed pill guidance in each week of the pill pack.

In producing a statement there is a balance between providing adequate information and losing impact if the text is too wordy. Therefore, on review of the draft statement by the Faculty of Sexual & Reproductive Healthcare (FSRH) it was decided that for the purposes of the

missed pill communication³ the information presented in Table 1 of that document and in the Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Authority (MHRA) statement⁴ would suffice. More detailed information is now available in the FSRH guidance on *Combined Hormonal Contraception* published in October 2011.⁵
